

Technical Talk with Bill Newell

Forgotten Lubrication Locations

Most of us are pretty conscientious about lubricating the well publicized lube locations such as steering and engine. But what about all those other little rub spots and wear

points that could cause our cars to quit performing as well as they should.


Over the years, I have put together a list of some of the forgotten locations on the Model A that need a little assist once in a while.

- The accelerator linkage assembly attached to the rear of the engine block next to the firewall has two holes in the top. This is for a drop of oil once in a while. This keeps the gas pedal operating smoothly. While we are talking about gas linkage, how about a drop of oil at the ends of the spark and gas linkages. This spring loaded joint can wear the ball off the end of the control rods if it doesn't get some lube.
- How about a drop of oil at each end of the motor in the horn? It can make the horn spin more freely and give a true ahooga sound.
- A little lube on the distributer cam can extend the life of your points and keep them set much longer. The key word is 'little'. We don't want the points fouled by excess lube.
- Inside your distributer housing, the upper plate moves in grooves when you advance and retard the spark. This groove can become worn and cause difficulty moving your spark lever. Removing the distributer, then cleaning and lubing the groove will make things work so much easier.
- While the distributer is out, you might put a drop or two of oil where the upper distributer shaft bushing is located. Ford didn't provide a positive lube location for the upper bushing.
- Are your spark and gas levers hard to move? A drop of oil in each of the lever holes under the horn will make things easier. They never get any oil!
- Do you thinks a drop of oil in your hood latches will make them easier to use? It does.

LUBRICATOR FITTING ON STEERING GEAR CHANGED TO A PLUG

To eliminate the possibility of mechanics putting grease instead of gear lubricant in the steering gear, the Zerk fitting has been replaced with a pipe plug (see Fig. 776).

Never put grease in the steering gear. Complaints of hard steering can invariably be traced to that source. Use gear lubricant only in the steering gear—the same lubricant that is used in the axle and transmission.




Gas Prices Around the World

If you thought that last summer the gasoline was expensive, look again! Just be glad that you don't live in Sierra Leone, where one gallon of gas is \$ 18.43 per gallon. In Norway a gallon costs you \$ 10.37 followed closely by the Netherlands with \$ 10.11. Compared with the former, we still have a bargain!

In the countries with lots of oil reserves, a gallon of gasoline only sets you back 79 cents in Kuwait and 45 cents in Saudi Arabia. No wonder they can afford to fill up those Rolls Royces and Bentleys!

When you ask around, people were doing the normal things on Tuesday, 29 July 2008 at about 1142AM. Some were going to lunch, others were in the office thinking about lunch, still others were having serious discussions about the important things in life. It was the last thing that that Drain Marshall and I were doing.

Drain had dropped by my garage in El Segundo where I was preparing Jan's Cabriolet for the upcoming car show in town. We were talking about important things like the merits of a Tillotson carb vs. a Zenith carb when I felt a little motion. I was standing at the time and didn't give it much thought. Drain was sitting on the shop stool and noticed the same motion, but it was a little magnified by the stool. Shortly thereafter, Drain said "I think we are having an earthquake!". By then, his car at the entrance to the garage was rocking and the overhead 8 ft fluorescent lights were swinging wildly back and forth. The telephone poles in the alley were swaying, the trees were shaking pretty hard too. Drain was in for the ride of his life on that stool! Soon it all stopped. The radio was on and the announcer was saying that we just had a 5.8 quake. Shortly it was revised to a 5.4 with the center about 30 miles east of Los Angeles, 8.5 miles beneath Chino Hills. Drain tried to call Doris, but, like the rest of Southern California, the phone system was jammed and couldn't get through.

Fortunately, nothing broke and the important discussion will have to continue at another time. Drain promised not to bring an earthquake with him the next time he drops by.

Quoting from the Southern California Earthquake Center bulletin, "Because this earthquake was widely felt but did little damage, it served as an excellent opportunity for Southern Californians to test their readiness in the event of a major earthquake. In November, people all across the region will participate in 'The Great Southern California Shakeout', the largest-ever earthquake drill in the United States. Please join us as we make history!"

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
