

### Some Steering Gear Basics



The steering and brakes in a Model A are probably the most important items to keep in tip-top condition. 80 year old cars,

like anything 80 years old, needs to be kept up and maintained. In our seminar October 18th, we will be looking at the steering gear of Pat and Sue's coupe.

Sue has complained about tough steering for a while so a rebuild is in order. Last year, we rebuilt the steering assembly so we know that is in good shape.



Sue's coupe is a 1930 so we know it has a 'two-tooth' steering gear. What does that mean? Inside the steering gear housing is a gear assembly. The number of teeth on the gear changed in 1929 from seven to two. Along with that change, several other items changed to make the assembly more serviceable and made the steering easier. The later housing has adjustments to take up for wear.



It also has a slightly better gear ratio making the steering easier. We will inspect the bearings, bushings, and other parts for wear and fix them as necessary,

Another trick being done is to shorten the Pitman arm about  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". This increases the mechanical advantage and really makes a difference. Maybe that will get replaced, too.

The steering gear technical seminar will be held at Pat and Sue's home, 821 W. Clarion Dr, Torrance, CA 90503. We will start at 10AM but some will be there a little earlier for coffee and donuts. This is a great topic and we'll get to see the inside of a two-tooth steering gear.



Pictured to the left is what a two-tooth steering gear housing looks like disassembled. The two pictures below show a rebuilt assembly ready for installation. The two screws at the top are for filling with oil and adjusting the bearing race assembly inside.






