


How to Approach a Restoration So you want to restore a car, eh? Or are you already in the process of restoring your Model A? Several reasons why a lot of incomplete restoration projects are coming up for sale lately: After restoring two Model A Fords myself, I can tell you that you need a five-year attention span. The problem is that a proper restoration can take at least that long. It may take a year to research the vehicle, learn the technology and plan the attack before picking up a wrench. Another reason for an unfinished restoration: lack of money. TV shows and videos, proposing to teach you to become a knowledgeable journeyman and tig-welder in two hours. Catalogs sell you equipment to do the most complex tasks for the high price of the right tools. And to top it off, the highly publicized auctions that seem to show how much money the finished product can bring when it's all over. When everything is hopelessly disassembled all over the garage floor - with patience, interest and budget depleted - the guy at the restoration shop will put it all together for you for \$100 per hour. And he is the only realistic one in the crowd. Anyone who starts removing things from the car without a plan will get nowhere beyond boxes with loose car parts and frustration and an e-bay ad for a partial basket case. A plan to restore a Model A should include: A) a realistic appraisal of personal skills. B) a realistic appraisal of the cost of having work done by others because of a lack of one's skills . a realistic appraisal of the time involved, and finally C) D) a realistic appraisal of the value of the finished product.

Fully understanding that A+B+C = D, a restoration can take a decade in time and thousands of dollars, but it can be done.

We need to remind any beginner to set realistic restoration goals and be

prepared to accept them. With the pressure off, this whole affair can become an enjoyable hobby, a relaxing pastime and a chance to join thousands of like-minded brothers and sisters in this most rewarding activity.






