

A Letter to the Tech Guy

Dear Tech Director:

Does octane rating of gasoline cause the valves to burn in my Model A Ford? Drain Marshall

Dear Drain:

Octane rating of gasoline does not cause the valves to burn. That rating is just a measure of its anti-knock quality. However the formulation of gasoline can burn valves. Let me explain:

Transportation fuels that are refined from petroleum oil have changed greatly over the years. This may cause a problem in vintage automobiles. The composition of fuel affects all aspects of the vintage engine such as compression ratio, displacement, operating temperatures, horsepower, torque characteristics and metallurgy.

Over the years, as refining technology has improved, "mogas" has evolved into "gasoline," from leaded, to unleaded, then reformulated, and now ultra-reformulated ethanol blend. The result is a very clean burning, low residue fuel that "by name only" resembles original gasoline from early refinery "stills". The problem arises when vintage engines use this new fuel. It may cause valve seat recession, fuel line aging, and improper carburetor jettings. Of these three, the primary concern is valve seat receding. Fuel lines can be upgraded to resist the reformulated fuels, carburetor can be rejetted, but valve seat recession must be addressed with additives and/or machine shop procedures.

Early gasoline was the light distillate boiling off a vat of crude oil. Essentially, it was called "straight run" gasoline. It would perform adequately in spark ignition engines with low compression ratios and rpm limits. During the mid 1920's, research was conducted on the addition of Tetraethyl Lead, (known as TEL), to straight-run gasoline, in order to allow a wide benefit of performance increases in gasoline engine design and output. By the 1970's, residual lead particles from gasoline became an environmental concern, and plans were made to reduce and then eliminate the lead content of gasoline. With the reduction of the lead content and further advances in fuel refining technology, it is now possible to make very high octane and low emission "gasoline" without the use of TEL.

The problems with older engines using newer fuel were first noticeable in the early 90' with hot-rodders and muscle car performances. When rebuilding and restoring these powerful, large displacement engines, machine shops noticed that valve seats were receding into the cylinder head. The only fix in was the installation of hardened valve seats and tougher valves. By the late 90's, petro-

leum companies had formulated aftermarket additives and sold "lead substitute" that could be added to each tank of fuel in vehicles that were originally designed for leaded fuel. This eliminated the valve seat problem.

In engines with mechanical valve clearances (as opposed to hydraulic lifters) adjustments need to be monitored for intake and especially exhaust valve clearances. If an older engine has been driven frequently with reformulated gasoline, there is a chance that valve seat receding has occurred. This can be seen by changes in the valve lash clearance. Valve seat receding is common even on modern engines, given enough time and operation.


It is important that whenever possible, the valve clearance must be adjusted to maintain optimum gap to ensure that the valves close completely. Valve seats that have started to recede can result in too tight gap settings. That affects the ability of the valve to seat properly on the seat. When the valve does not seat properly, heat from combustion is not transferred to the cylinder head. This can result in a burned valve. Typically only the exhaust valve is affected, as the intake valve is cooled by the incoming fuel/air charge.

Unless you want to remove the cylinder head for machine shop work, keep a close eye on valve lifter clearances and use "lead substitute" additive with each tank of gasoline. This will ensure further longevity and proper operation of your vintage engine.








As at Will Rogers park




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
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
