Next Board Meeting


The **December** board meeting will be held at 5PM before the regular business meeting on December 11th. This will be a short meeting.


Editor's Corner by Dick Wyckoff

Checking the Alternator. What's Right?

Dear Tech. Director:

The other day I saw a mechanic disconnect the battery lead on his Model A engine while running it at a fast idling speed. The engine was equipped with an alternator in place of a generator. When I asked the mechanic why he was doing it that way he explained:

"If the engine is running while the battery is disconnected, the alternator is producing the current for the ignition circuit and is therefore working properly". Is this an accurate way to test an alternator? Bill DeWitt, Yankton, IA

Dear Bill:

No, that procedure does not prove that the alternator is in perfect shape. Most alternator stators have three sets of windings and three sets of rectifier diodes. If one of the windings or diodes has gone bad, the alternator would still produce enough current for the ignition circuit, but won't produce enough current to keep the battery fully charged. The most accurate way to test an alternator is with an ammeter, voltmeter and ohmmeter.

There is more to this. Suppose the alternator is in good condition. Disconnecting the battery lead may damage it. Allowing an alternator to operate without a battery lead can cause a rise in voltage that can cause stress on the alternator windings. Also when the battery lead is disconnected a high voltage spike is induced in the electrical system. This spike, which can reach 150 volts, may damage the diodes as well as the regulator. When the battery lead is reconnected, another spike is produced. Therefore, disconnecting the battery lead with the engine running is not a good idea.

DID YOU KNOW THAT MARC OFFERS A DRIVING AWARDS PROGRAM??????

The following information describes the requirements if you would like to participate in the National MARC Driving Awards Program.

MARC DRIVING AWARDS STANDARDS

1. PURPOSE:

The purpose of the Driving Awards is to offer National recognition for all miles driven by Model "A's". There is no intent to supersede or cancel any Regional or local driving programs now in existence; rather it seeks to further them by offering a driven car recognition for all MARC vehicles.

2. GENERAL:

All Model "A's" owned by MARC members, and registered in the Driving Awards Program, which meet the following standards are eligible.

A. Or original manufacture from 1927 thru 1931.

B. Titled or registered as a Model ``A" in accordance with respective state requirements.

- C. Authentic in over-all appearance, with a minimum of following basic features:
- 1. Of original manufacture from 1927 thru 1931.
- 2. Original Ford four-cylinder engine produced from 1927 thru 1934.
- 3. Original body style for year of manufacture.
- 4. Titled or registered as a Model "A" in accordance state requirements.

3. RULES FOR MILES DRIVEN:

- A. All ground mileage is credited, except non-emergency tow.
- B. All credited mileage is cumulative from year to year, and to each higher award level.
- C. Mileage to be credited must be attested.
- D. No mileage is credited for any period of time that the owner is not a member of the Model A Restorers Club.
- E. Mileage does not have to be updated every year to maintain eligibility.
- F. Mileage is accumulated through the reporting of the ODOMETER reading as of December 31st of each year.
- G. The MARC Driving Awards Committee is the final authority on mileage credit and awards.

4. NATIONAL AWARDS:

A. Award recognition begins at 2,000 miles; the second award level is 5,000 miles and subsequent levels are at each additional 5,000 miles thereafter.

- B. In the event more than one level is reached during the reporting year, only the higher will be given.
- C. A radiator plaque in the symbol of the Model A Restorers Club logo is awarded for the first mileage level of 2,000 miles, and a replacement mileage tab thereafter.

5. CERTIFICATION:

A. A one-time registration fee of \$1.00 per vehicle is required at time of vehicle registration.

B. MARC will maintain the original registration card as a permanent record for each vehicle registered and receiving recognition.

C. A vehicle transferred to a new MARC member, who re-registers the car, will maintain its mileage award level, and continues eligibility for further awards in accordance with the rules.

6. PROCEDURES:

A. The awards system is on an annual basis.

B. Regions are responsible to distribute the MARC Mileage Registration cards to those members wanting to participate in the Driving Awards Program.

C. Each Region establishes a screening process by which those members wanting to participate, are checked mileage information, authenticity of vehicle, and status of Regional and Nation membership.

MARC members not belonging to a Region, may apply directly to the National Office or to MARC's Driving Awards Program Chairman.


D. Regions should appoint an individual as local Driving Awards Chairman, who will consolidate and report members year end Odometer readings. These reading should be reported to the MARC Driving Awards Committee so as to arrive no later than February 28th of each year.

E. Awards recognition and distribution may be made at either the Spring Membership Meeting, or through the mail to the local Region Chairman for presentation to the members.




