

REPORT ON THE NATIONAL MODEL A FORD MUSEUM by Sue Hankins

Bob has asked me, as Historian, if I would be the liaison between our club and MAFFI (Model A Ford Foundation, Inc). MAFFI has existed for over twenty years and their goal from the beginning has been to establish a National Model A Ford Museum. They are presently in negotiations with the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners, Michigan. See www.gilmorecarmuseum.org for the museum location. They will need to build a building and fill it with displays. They are asking for input, advice and assistance of Model A Clubs nationwide for the museum design, interior layout, car and display designs and fund raising. Donations of any kind are tax deductible. So far, MAFFI owns eight vehicles. They need more cars, parts, accessories, tools and fashions.

As a way of supporting the museum building fund, MAFFI is raffling a restored 1930 Model A Tudor, donated by one of the members. It has 500 miles on a 1990 restoration; always stored inside; LeBaron-Bonney interior; rebuilt engine; Andalusite Blue paint and is ready to drive. The drawing will be held July 1, 2011at the MARC National Meet in San Diego.. Tickets are \$10 for 1; \$25 for 3; \$50 for 9. I will have tickets at the Business Meeting.

Also, Bob Trousil, who many of you know from the Downey club, is chairing a MAFFI project of restoring a 1929 Sedan. They have a running chassis but need some parts. I'll have a list of the parts at the meeting. You can also get a tax credit for your cash donation by getting the price of the part you wish to donate from Bob bobtrousil@aol.com and Bob can buy the part locally. 
Editor's Corner by Dick Wyckoff

Ron and I first met Jack in 1991, when we pulled up in front of his house to get a closer look at the 1928 roadster sitting on the lawn with a "For Sale" sign in the window. We got out of our car and Jack came out of his house. We liked the car and Jack instantly. He had an easy laugh and a friendly way. He looked like my Dad, who was the same age and had died shortly before. They both had served in WWII and both had years of stories to tell. We knew immediately that we'd made a friend for years to come. Jack said he'd throw in a Harbor A's membership with the sale and we shook hands.

This week we attended his funeral. It was a nice ceremony and well attended, considering that he was almost 95, and that most of his peers have gone ahead of him. All five of his and Cecelia's children were there with many grandchildren and long-time friends. There was a hand-made sign on the floor that said, "Life is a bowl of cherries." They played the song, one of Jack's favorites. I'd forgot that he'd told me a few years ago that he's chosen that song for his funeral. The thought made me smile. There was a nice slide show of Jack's life...a lot of pictures of him with cars and there was our roadster. Jack looked very spiffy wearing his neat Harbor A club jacket, complete with metals and pins. He was a great club booster and no event was complete without his attendance. It began to rain mid-way through the ceremony and by the time we made our way up the hill, it was pouring. At the grave, waiting for us, were 2 faithful sailors who were doing their part for Jack. Just as we got there, the rain stopped. Jack would have smiled.

If asked to describe our friend, Ron and I would say that he is "a stand-up kind of guy". The kind you could count on in a pinch. He had a good sense of humor and I can still hear his laugh. He and his wife Cecilia made a life together with the kids and when she died, he remarried pretty quickly. When he told me that he was getting married again, he told me he hated being alone. So he made another life with his new wife and moved south. We got to see him occasionally and enjoyed seeing him at a big party when he turned 90. Many members trekked down to pay homage to the guest of honor. When his new wife's health declined and she began to suffer from Alzheimer's, he moved again to live with his daughter in San Francisco. When we last saw him he was talking about getting another Model A and fixing it up. You had to work hard not to like Jack Ripley. It was a privilege knowing you, faithful friend and we'll miss you.

The address is 17400 Hawthorne Blvd., Torrance CA. Come on by, have a cup of Starbucks, and get your weekend started in true So. California style.




Weekly Family Food Festivities:


The Pomona Valley and Paradise Valley Model A Clubs sponsor a joint meet in Laughlin on **April 15 - 18th**.
