
Friday, May 28th, also at the Walteria Clubhouse. The doors are open early for set-up. Come by and help and enjoy swapping adventure stories with others.


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#### Monday Weekly Family Food Festivities:

The Hot 'n Tot is located at 2347 Pacific Coast Highway in Lomita, CA. It's about a half mile east of Crenshaw Blvd., north side.





Several years ago I had a problem with my Model A. This problem went on for months and actually made me stop driving my car because it just wasn't fun. The car is fully restored, very pretty and gets a lot of attention when out on the road; it has a new engine (H and H touring motor) that really handles today's freeway speeds so it is fun to take anywhere.

The problem started out in San Bernardino at the Route 66 car show which is a three day event with a lot of car cruising. I drove the car out there with no problems, everything went great, but in one of the cruising tours the engine just died for no reason. I got it out of the way and opened the hood looking for something obvious, coil wire or distributor clip, but it looked ok. So I got back in to try it and it started right up? Weird, maybe some sort of vapor lock because of the heat and the slow driving? On Sunday the event was over so Elyse and I jumped in and started for home. We were on the 10 freeway in the slow lane running about 55 mph and after a few miles it did it again, just died; luckily there was a shoulder I could pull off. Jumped out again, opened the hood and everything looked good so I tried to start it, started right up. Took off again and in about 10 miles it did it again. Same routine, pull over, jump out look at nothing, and fiddle with the carburetor, starts right up. Now I am getting nervous because with all the freeway widening, often there is no shoulder but we keep going. I had been lucky so far but finally, after it did it again, I get off of the freeway and we go surface streets. Going surface streets from San Bernardino to Redondo Beach is not easy and you have to go through some very strange areas that Model A's are at best an unusual site but we finally get home.

After all of this I am convinced it is a gas problem and maybe a chunk of something floating around in the carburetor, gas line or tank. On the way home I started rocking the car when it died, sloshing the gas around in the tank thinking it was maybe a chunk of dirt or rust clogging the gas line.

I tore into it, pulled the carburetor and rebuilt it looking for something clogged. Nothing obvious but maybe I fixed it. Started driving it again and it seemed to be corrected. Then it happened again, same thing, same way, just died while running then would start up after I pulled over. Pulled the carburetor again, went through it, nothing. Start driving it again and after a while it would do it again.

I was getting frustrated and ended up not driving the car much because I couldn't depend on it. Sometimes it would run good and then, at what seemed as always the most inappropriate time, it would just die, usually in an intersection or in an area that you don't want to be out under the hood of your car. I must have had the carbure-tor apart ten times. Now I am thinking I am going to have to pull the gas tank because something is floating around in there and clogging the gas line outlet. I am dreading the thought of pulling the gas tank out of a fully restored car because I remember how hard it was to get it in the car without scratching it. Then once it is out of the car how do I clean it? Plus, naturally I have a full tank of gas so I have an additional problem of getting 10 gallons of gas out of the car and into something.

So I let the car sit, maybe a month or two, and I am thinking about how to solve my problem. I am convinced I have to pull the tank out of the car, put some cleaner in it, slosh it around and try to dislodge or dissolve whatever is in there without scratching it or staining the paint. Or maybe I just eat it, pull the tank, flush the tank

out, put in sealer, repaint and hope the paint matches the car and then reinstall the tank. For those of you that have never installed a Model A gas tank it is not an easy or fun job. It takes ten hands, you have to hold everywhere and there is no good place to hold. The gas tank beading also has to be installed at the same time. The beading is also painted and is installed between the body and the tank and the beading has to be adjusted up and down with cloth strips stapled every inch or so because you can't see or feel the flange. All this has to happen at one time while not scratching the outside body paint, the beading paint or the dash board paint, plus adjusting the beading by pulling on the cloth strips, hence the ten hands.

#### Outsmarting your Model A (continued)

After a few more months I decide I have obviously overlooked something, this can't be this hard, it is only a Model A and nothing is that hard on a Model A and I have been working on this one since I was a kid. So I start all over again, I fully re-read the carburetor book, borrow a Carburetor rebuild CD from Drain, watch it two or three times and rebuild the carburetor once again. This time I paying special attention to all the little passages, pushing very fine wire through all the passageways I can access, gauge the metering, re-bush the throttle shaft, and set the float using every precision tool I have. Then I run several gallons of gas through the gas line into a hose then into a bucket while I watch for any dirt or rust. This time I got it, whatever it was is gone so I take it out for a drive. I drive it all over South Bay and it works perfectly, must have done 25 or 30 miles, so I decide I will take Elyse out to dinner and then pick up her brother, arriving from Georgia, at LAX after dinner. We go to dinner in Play Del Rey and the car stumbles once going down Pershing Drive, just coughed then continued. No big deal, don't worry about it......

During dinner I am looking out at the car, my car and it looks good, perfect. After dinner we headed for LAX up Manchester and half way up the hill from Pursing Drive it dies again same as before. I restart it and out of desperation I think "well maybe the gas is dead" and that is why it stumbled earlier so I pull a u-turn and go to the Mobil Station at the bottom of the hill, pull into the pump, jump out and pulled the gas cap. AND PHUFFFFF. Air gets sucked into the tank. "SON OF A GUN, THAT'S MY PROBLEM" !!!! The gas cap, even though it had visible vent holes in it, had somehow clogged itself enough to cause a temporary vacuum when the gas went down which would stop the flow of gas, like holding your finger over one end of the straw full of liquid. By the time I would get the car pulled over it would leak enough air through it to make the vacuum go away and the gas would start flowing so the car would re-start.

So I loosened the gas cap, drove to LAX, picked up my brother-in-law, and had a smile on my face all the way home, thinking what's the chance of that ever happen again.

Later, I drilled more holes in the gas cap, this baby is getting lots of air now, and have been driving carefree every since.


# Future Local and Long Distance Events of Interest











