Upcoming Business Meetings


The *November* meeting will be **Friday**, Nov 26th at 7:30PM at the Walteria Clubhouse. We will vote on next year's Board of Directors.


Several members then started to work on Al's front brakes. The mechanics explained what they were doing as they were working while others gathered around listening and asking questions. We always learn something whether working or watching.




Editor's Corner by Dick Wyckoff

If you remember, last month's issue of the HarborLight had several pages of pictures from our great tour of the Old Ridge Route near Gorman, CA. There were four Model As from the Harbor Club and four from the Orange County Club.

During that tour, the women members of the Ridge Route Preservation group met us with prepared snacks and drinks. One of our members, Georgette Avoian, absolutely fell in love with some Lemon Bars that one of the ladies prepared for us. She followed up and contacted Maggie Smith, the 'Bar Lady' and got the recipe. So here it is:



Lemon Bars From Maggie Smith

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

- 1. Mix 1 1/2 c. flour with 1/2 c. sugar. Work in 1/2 c. melted butter or margarine. Pat mixture into well-greased 9X13 pan and bake 12 minutes.
- 2. Combine the following and spread on top of first layer to bake another 20 minutes: 2 eggs, 1 c. sugar, 1 1/2 c. coconut, 1 c. nuts (finely chopped), 1 tsp. vanilla, 2 tablespoons flour, 1/2 tsp. baking powder, 1/2 tsp. salt, 2 tablespoons lemon juice. (Don't over bake.)

When cool, glaze with: 1 tablespoon butter, melted, 1/2 c. powdered sugar, and 2 tablespoons lemon juice, blended in saucepan. (I usually make double or triple the glaze).

Let sit 30 minutes before cutting into bars.
