
#### 2011 MARC National Meet in Review by Dick Wyckoff

The MARC National Meet has come to an end. All the hard work by many people has paid off. 275 registrations or about 600 people enjoyed the weeklong festivities at the beautiful Town and Country Resort in San Diego. Representing the Harbor Area Region on the Pacific A's Region board for two years for the event were **Dan Fitzgerald** and **Dick Wyckoff**. Dan was Treasurer and Dick was a Vice President.

Harbor was well represented at the affair with 18 registrations or about 35 people. They got to enjoy events such as the many technical seminars for men and women, tours to local attractions, special inter-

est regions such as Cabriolet group or AA group or Smith compressor group, viewing of some of the best Model As in the world, a weeklong swap meet, hospitality refreshments, social gatherings with new friends, a great raffle, an indoor swap meet, a harbor cruise, car games, a great 35 mile Grand Tour and, of course, the awards banquet on Friday night. Technical Talk with Charlie Plessner



**Fixing Starters** 

As we all know, the electric starter (when activated) turns the engine over until it will start and run by itself.

The electric starter was invented by the Cadillac motor company in 1912, first used by Ford on the 1919 Model "T" at extra cost, and became standard on all Fords from 1926 to present day. The Model "A" electric starter is a well designed motor that rarely ever has a problem (when used right).

The leading problem is increased electrical resistance due to corrosion, which will make them run slower or sometimes not run at all.

Thankfully most all of the internal components are available new, which makes them easy to rebuild. Usually replacing the brushes and fields fixes them. I have fixed many starters this way, and with great success.

The Model "A" starter was originally a 6 volt positive ground motor, however it will work on negative ground systems. Using 12 volts? No problem, the motor can be converted easily by installing 12 volt fields which are also available new.
