



Great time, great people. Thanks to all who worked so hard to make it possible.



<u>Technical Talk</u> with Charlie Plessner



First, I would like to thank everyone who came and helped out at the overdrive installation in Dot Knott's sedan on August 6th.

Model "A" Springs

Springs suspend an automobile from the axles to isolate the impact of uneven parts of the road. The Ford Model "A" was equipped with two leaf type springs (one for each axle). Other makes at that time used four springs (two for each axle) but Ford argued that two works better.



Spring problems

People have reported problems with their Model "A" springs squeaking, locking up, and even leaning. All are problems caused by age and use. Squeaky springs have an obvious cause, dry and/or rusty spring leaves (no oil or grease in them). "Locking up" is caused by the edges of the spring leafs wearing grooves in each other. The leaves can't pass the edge of the grooves, so it keeps the spring from moving. Leaning to the left side is common with old cars because it's the heaver (driver) side.

Fixing and restoring springs

The way I restore Model "A" springs is

- 1. Disassemble the springs. A Safety item: Wrap the spring with rope and use C-clamps before removing the center bolt to prevent the leaves from flying and possibly hurting someone.
- 2. Get each leaf sandblasted on both sides.
- 3. Grind down the parts of the leaves where the worn grooves are to make them smooth again. If the grooves are worn too deeply, I usually fill them in with welded metal.
- 4. Chamfer the bottom edge of each leaf end slightly upward to prevent further wear.
- 5. Paint each leaf.
- 6. Put a layer of grease between each leaf, and reassemble them. I usually reverse every other leaf to avoid leaning.

This usually solves all spring problems. Let me know if you want to know more, or have any other questions. Charlie




