


Upcoming Tours



Bill was President of the Harbor Area Model A Club twice. First in 1988-1989 and then again 2009. He was also Vice President for several years. He was on many committees, too. His ideas about how things should be handled were never a secret. A character, he was. We'll miss that.

His love for his family was never in doubt. His wife, Gloria, was by his side for 49 1/2 years. His twin brother, Bob, shared many of his interests, especially those associated with cars and boats. There was always a little competition that kept both of them striving to do better. Bill had another brother, Gary, two sons, Bill Jr. and Craig, three grandchildren and a great grand-daughter. Through thick and thin, Bill was always there for them. We'll miss that.

MAFFI Museum Update

The early events for constructing the Model A Ford Museum building are underway. A topographic survey

has been done and a site plan is being started. The final design contract will be signed by the end of the month. Meanwhile a MAFFI team is conducting a visual inspection and inventory of existing museum display items.

The fund drive to pay for the museum is continuing. MAFFI now has a broker (Edward Jones) and can accept gifts of stock and if you have an IRA that requires a mandatory distribution that you don't need, you can donate the distribution to the museum and not have to pay taxes on it.

Each club can help and many are. For example, clubs are holding special events to raise money for the museum. Illinois Region of MARC had a swap meet, Grape Country A's had an auction, both resulting in substantial donations How about your club holding a road rally or a poker run, a car wash, or a brakes inspection day, each with a fee to go to the museum. Other fun events might include a Biggest Loser contest among portly club members with the monthly collections based on promised versus actual weight loss, all going to the museum fund. Another idea is to charge "tuition" for an all-day technical seminar (valve grinding, transmission rebuild, etc) with proceeds going to the museum. The Club's Cool Tool Update by Bobby DeCrescenzo

During this past year the board had allowed me some monies to buy a few new tools.

I purchased six new tools to add to our list of what we already own. The new tools are:

- #1 Distributor bushing reamer
- #2 Light switch spider installation tool
- #3 Engine broken stud removal tool
- #4 Distributor timing wrench
- #5 Electrical voltage tester
- #6 Ignition spark tester

I will publish a list of all the tools for the January HarborLight.

Anyone in our club can borrow any of the tools for a job they might need to do for a deposit of \$20. They get their deposit back when the tool is returned in its original condition.





Technical Talk with Charlie Plessner



Modifications

Over the years there have been countless modifications for the Model 'A' to make it a better and more modern car. Some good, some bad, and some ugly. There have been many good ideas, but sometimes people get carried away with them. The way some people talk it seems the Model 'A' couldn't possibly have run or even driven when new. (Don't forget Ford sold almost 5.000.000 of them, so someone must have thought they were good cars). I thought I'd just state my opinion on some common modifications.

Alternators:

Many people like alternators because it's an easy way to (bolt on) 12 volts. Some use them because they're afraid of the adjustable brush, or the original generator just ain't good enough. After 80 years they're usually not, but new parts and rebuilt units are available. Adjusting the brush on the generator is an easy job. To do so, refer to your Ford service manual.

Seat belts:

Seat belts are a good idea when properly installed. Since there is no DOT approved way of installing them in old cars, it gets very arbitrary. Small wood screws or glue are not strong enough fasteners. When installing them, just keep in mind they have to support you in a collision.

Muffler heat deflectors:

They work fine. no side effects.

Halogen headlight bulbs:

They may be needed if you're using the reproduction chrome reflectors instead of the original silver ones. But you're not completely blind in the dark without them. You might need an alternator, too.

Steering stabilizers:

Some people have told me "all Model A's need them". They're good for cover-

ing up problems caused by bent front axles, worn out joints or other subnormal conditions. But front end shimmy was not a problem when these cars were new, and is not a problem on many today.

When in doubt just think stock and you'll probably be okay.







