

# Holiday Motor Excursion



In June, my car earned a Third prize, Touring Class at the 2011 MARC National Meet held in San Diego. Yes, I drove the car back from San Diego (125 miles) and have driven it as far north as Gorman (90 miles) to tour the "Old Ridge Route." The Harbor Model A Club takes monthly drives and frequently participates in parades.

Overcoming the reluctance of Ford President, Robert McNamara, "little birds" were produced in 1955, 56, and 57. But T-Bird owners complained that the visibility was limited and the trunk could not accommodate two sets of golf clubs. Portholes were added to the hard top and the spare tire was moved to a continental kit at the back of the car. Production on the 56 was curtailed early in order to bring out the 57 which was lengthened to accommodate the spare tire and two sets of clubs in the trunk. The "little birds" brought people to the show room to buy the standard Fords with lookalike T-Bird features including headlights, tail lights and other trim.

A popular magazine advertisement for the 1956 T-Bird shows a distinguished man sitting in the car in the show room, looking at his image from a walled mirror with the caption "Father's Mink Coat." In 1958, Ford introduced the rear seat T-Bird. My car is Colonial White, with Black/White interiors and a black convertible top. It is equipped with the largest engine of that time and a Fordomatic drive. It has a black soft top, power windows, power seats, power steering and power brakes. This car was delivered to Ira Escobar Ford Dealership in El Segundo and purchased by the then owner of the gas station at the corner of PCH and Narbonne. He lived in Rolling Hills. My brother's father-in-law purchased it in the early 1970's while living in RHE and restored it about 10 years later. He retired and moved to Palm Desert. I bought the car in 2009 with 58K miles. I've added an air conditioner. Most of my effort has been spent on correcting intermittent problems like "shorts", overheating, rattles, and cosmetic improvements including the restoration of the engine compartment to look like it did when it arrived from the factory with all the quality stamps and decals on various parts of the car.

It has been awarded "Best of Show" trophies, and 2nd place Touring Class at the Southern California Pageant of the Thunder-birds featuring cars from all over Southern California.

We drive the car to monthly meetings and excursions of our club, *The Early Birds of Southern California*. We've toured the California and Arizona portions of Route 66 and driven as far north as Solvang and the wine country with club members. Neither car has had to be towed or have major repairs on the road, although there have been times when my wife didn't feel we would make it back without a flat bed. Both cars have been exhibited at fund raising charity events and I have been able to create a sponsorship for both clubs at the Automobile Driving Museum in El Segundo. Schedule conflicts have prevented us from participating in the PV Concourse but we look forward to participating in the future.

Best of all.....my wife and my mistresses are compatible.

# Model A Tech Tips "The Model A Horn"

Taken from the Ford Service Bulletin Vol. 9, February, 1928

#### The Horn

The quality of tone and length of service received from Ford horns depends entirely on the care they

To produce the most effective tone it is necessary that the armature revolve at a high rate of speed. This speed is possible only when bearings are properly oiled, and the commutator and brushes are kept clean.

#### Lubrication

Once a month remove motor cover located at rear of horn and place a few drops of oil in groove at each end of the armature shaft. See "B" in the picture. Use light fine oil.

To clean the commutator, set the motor in motion by pressing the horn button. While motor is revolving, hold a piece of fine sandpaper against commutator until commutator is clean.

Next, with a small piece of wood clean the gaps between the commutator segments. Do not use metal when cleaning gaps.


When turned with the fingers, the armature should revolve freely. Should it fail to operate, examine the battery, the wiring and the horn button.

Also, you may want to remove the light switch from the bottom of the steering column and make sure the terminals are clean and free of grease. Both the horn and the lights could be affected by greasy, dirty contacts.

#### Adjustment

Turning the adjusting screw (see figure "A"), regulates the tone.

Turning the screw to the right tightens the adjustment. Turning to the left loosens it. Regulate the adjustment until the desired tone is obtained.
