Our September meeting will be on Friday, September 28th at 7:30, at Walteria Clubhouse.




Model A Electrical Service Review

Even tho we live in a mild climate here in Southern California, it is important to take a few minutes each year to make sure the

electrical system in our Model As is up to par. We have seen many problems traced back to corroded terminals or loose connections. Problems such as a lazy horn, hard starting, overcharging, dim lights, non-operational electric windshield wiper, etc. can be traced to poor connections.

Below is a page taken from the Ford Service Bulletins that covers all the basics for proper service of the electrical system. Take a few minutes and review your car's electrical health. Your Model A will be better for it.




