TESTING THE MODEL A SKELETON By E. J. EATON

The elapsed time between restoration of the Model A chassis and installation of the body is usually quite long, resulting in delayed testing and adjustments of the mechanical and ignition system of the car. Early starting and testing of the vehicle (before body installation) is desirable due to accessibility of the engine, drive train, chassis, brakes, steering and etc. Should the testing and trial run uncover major problems, repairs would be less costly and time consuming at this point than would be after complete assembly of the car.

By means of a simple installation, the restorer can start and test drive the "skeeter" to assure himself of troublefree operation later on. The parts needed for the installation are: coil, ammeter, ignition switch cable, insulated wire, gas line, metal container (approximately one quart) for gas and two wooden boards; a 1" x 2" for mounting component parts on, and a 2" x 10" bolted down across the frame to serve as a seat. (Refer to drawings for component installation details.)

After installation, start the engine and check for ignition timing, carburetor adjustment, generator charge rate, cooling system, exhaust leaks, clutch, gear shift, engine,



transmission, drive train, brakes, steering, etc. You're sure to enjoy the sound of the stripped Model A. It's a real pleassure to drive too. The 40 horsepower seems more like a hundred, so hang on!

We do not advocate street driving at this stage, since the running gear would probably be unlicensed, and not considered safe for highway use. When driving, keep an eye on the gas supply and don't wander off too far. A quart of gas doesn't last very long, even in a four cylinder car.
