
#### Technical Talk

#### Tech Tip

#### Removal of front spring perches

The front spring perches mounted in the front axle can be a very stubborn part to remove and a method that works very well is to make a press using some Model A parts. It involves using the two front spring U bolts (part # A5455B) and the front spring center lower plate (part #A5458). Remove the nut that fastens the perch in place. Place a U bolt on the axle on each side of the front wishbone and position the dimple in the spring plate over the threaded part of the spring perch. The U bolt must have good threads because this will require a lot of force and rusted or pitted threads will strip easily before the perch budges from its resting place. Non castle type nuts are recommended because they provide more thread coverage and load bearing ability. Tighten the four nuts on the U bolts uniformly. This applies pressure to push the perch out of the axle. If this does not move the perch, heat may be needed to help loosen the bond of rust. This procedure works well even when the front axle is still on the car.



#### From the 'Model A Judging Standards and Restoration Guidelines',

Page 3-3: Hoses and Clamps.

....Original clamps were either zinc or cadmium plated and were not stamped with size numbers. The clamps were generally installed as follows:

The upper clamps both had the screw on the top side of the hose with the head toward the driver's side. The lower clamp nearest the radiator had the screws on the outside of the hose with the heads facing upward. The clamps at the inlet casting had the screws on the top of the hose with the heads toward the driver's side.
