For many years Mel operated a cottage industry offering quality rebuilt Model A parts. His specialty was F-100 steering box conversions and cast iron brake drums. Mel was also a very generous man. Each year he would make a very generous donation of Model A parts for the raffle at the annual Pancake Breakfast hosted by the Orange County Model A Ford Club.

Mel's Model A cottage industry will be carried on by his son Randy, who lives in Huntington Beach, California 714-292-8660. Former member **Floyd Carr** passed away By Dick Wyckoff

Floyd Carr died of natural causes in his sleep January 17, 2014. Floyd was 92 years old and lived his entire life in El Segundo. A Rotary International member for 60 years as well as Mayor of El Segundo, He was a great man and I was proud to call him my friend. # Technical Talk

# The Model A Cooling Fan

Several articles have been written about keeping the Model A temperature under control. Several items play a part in the process, one of which is the cooling fan. Not many people realize that the fan is turning  $\frac{1\frac{1}{2}}{1}$  times the engine speed. That means it better be in good condition to take the engine speeds we see today. Remember that the original propeller fan made in 1930 is close to 85 years old and has been around the block a few times!

It is important to check the fit of the fan on the water pump shaft. It is a taper with a key and a slotted nut with a cotter pin. If this assembly is in any way loose, it must be fixed or replaced. Failure to fix this problem will result in unwanted vibration and eventually the fan will fail. A fan failure on the road can result in damaged hoods and radiators and make a real mess out of engine and electrical parts. Many of us use four-bladed fans. The preferred ones are the original Ford replacement fans that are riveted. There are also four-bladed fans that are bolted together. Make sure the bolts are tight.

Original fans are required for fine-point judging but not for the everyday driver. There are aftermarket, two-bladed aluminum fans and six-bladed plastic fans that would serve our needs better. This could be a real safety issue. Exploding fans can be very dangerous. In a article in the 'Model A Times' magazine, an air flow study was made on all these fans. The newer, multi-bladed fans pulled a lot more air than the original fan and they were recommended replacements for the stock fan.

Bottom line is use the original fan for show cars only. Change it out to a modern one for safety and cooling performance improvement. The cost is about \$50 and could save a lot of grief sometime in the future.

# BAD GAS OR E-10?

Do you really have an ignition problem or is it bad fuel? Never has fuel been a bigger problem. The villain is E-10, the ethanol-gasoline mix that is now standard issue at most fuel pumps as the government seeks to decrease air pollution and reduce America's reliance on imported petroleum. E10 means 10 percent ethanol, which is basically corn alcohol. The mix seems to work fine in modern cars, which burn through a tank in a hurry. But it poses problems in Model A's which sit a lot.





Why? As E10 sits, the ethanol and gasoline start to separate. Ethanol goes to the bottom of the tank. If there's water there, or if water vapor exists, the ethanol absorbs it. Before long, you've got a clump of watery ethanol at the bottom of the tank. When you crank up the motor, the crud is sucked into the carburetor and plugs things up. The next thing you know is your Model A isn't running very well. That's not all. Ethanol is a solvent, so when it gets into older fuel systems it can clean out the gunk and varnish that's accumulated over the years and send it downstream to clog tiny carburetor jets. It also breaks down rubber gaskets. This one's for real. So what to do?

The two most popular stabilizers are **StarTron** and **Sta-Bil** (Marine Formula), both of which help keep ethanol from separating, and as a result keeps water that gets absorbed in the fuel from accumulating in trouble-some concentrations at the bottom of the tank. But you must put the stabilizer in when you fuel up. It doesn't do any good to do it afterwards. Stabilize the fuel in the recommended amount and leave the tank 95% full of fresh gas. Follow the directions on the container.

You can purchase a 32 oz bottle of **Sta-Bil "Marine Formula - Ethanol Treatment"** (which treats 320 gallons) at Wal-Mart in the boating section and add it on every fill up. The nice thing about **Sta-Bil** is that it has that neat dispensing bottle that the **StarTron** does not.
