





Technical Talk

Adjusting Mechanical Brakes

Mechanical brakes have sort of been a mystery in making them work properly. We follow the directions in all the publications and they never seem quite right. We then assume that that is the best they will be. Marco Tahtaras, one of the gurus of Model As, and others answered a question on Fordbarn.com recently that all of a sudden made sense. It seems most of us are working with worn parts to some degree or another while the Model A publications assume everything is new. Marco stepped back and modified the procedure to allow for some wear. This was done on Jan Wyckoff's Cabriolet and Steve Preston's pickup with great success.


The following three paragraphs answering the question were taken from the Fordbarn.com discussion:

The question posed was "Why didn't the brakes work when he followed the books to the letter. . . "

- 1. How did you set the levers at 15 degrees? If you did so with pills (push rod shims) then your shoes are FAR from centered. If you just leaned the levers forward by lengthening the rods then you have essentially deactivated the front brakes. There should be NO backlash at the levers. That means you push each lever rearward SOFTLY until it stops. Then set the length of the rod so the pin slips through with it in that position.
- 2. You mention adjusting with the wrench, which means you're turning the square headed dohickey, that's the adjusting wedge. Keep adjusting that until the drum barely turns freely from the tight locked position. Work the actuating lever a few a times and readjust the wedge again until the drum barely contacts the brake shoes. You want the drum/wheel to turn freely. Then, leave it alone. Next look at the actuating lever, pull/push lightly toward the back of the vehicle to remove any slack. It should still be forward of vertical. Then pull on the brake rod, loosen the lock nut, and adjust the brake rod clevis until the clevis pin just fits into the clevis. That's it.

Take for a ride and see how it acts. If one wheel needs a little correcting, then I readjust the rod length, but, most give a wedge a click [tight wheel a click looser]. Overheated drums come from too much contact with the shoes.

3. With the brake rods disconnected, I adjust the front brakes until they lock, then back off until they just turn free. Pull the lever back by hand until free movement at the lever is removed. Adjust the clevis on the brake rod until the clevis pin will just enter the hole on the brake lever. This will have the brake shoes ready to expand when you push the pedal. If you are trying to adjust the brake rods to an exact length like a certain mechanics hand books say, that is your problem. All slack has to be removed at the brake rod connection or the brakes will be poor or NO brakes at all.

Tranny Troubles by Bobby DeCrescenzo

On Christmas morning I got a gift I REALLY DIDN'T WANT. On the way home from church, the transmission in our Tudor decided to give up by breaking two teeth off of the cluster gear! After limping home, I took the shifting cover off and there the two teeth were laying in the bottom of the case. I had to decide whether to pull the engine or pull out the rear end in order to drop the transmission out. It was decided to take the rear end out while the newly ordered parts were on their way. I bought all new gears, bearings, spacers, shafts and gaskets. I had a new clutch disk ready to go. With the transy

out ,cleaned and inspected , it was a breeze to reassemble it with the help of Les Andrews Model A Mechanics Handbook. I had the car back together and running in a few days. I encountered a problem shifting it (the new gears were grinding badly). After a few clutch pedal adjustments , it was much, much better.

But there is one adjustment I did not know about until after I finished the job. I thought I would write this to let anyone who might do a transmission in the future and not check this adjustment. It is the "clutch pressure plate finger adjustment" that has a specific measurement and can be adjusted while the car is apart. Very simply --- with the new clutch disk in and the pressure plate bolted to the flywheel, you take a straight edge across the back of the pressure plate and then with a scale ruler measure from the bottom edge of the straight edge to the top of the fingers of the pressure plate. This measurement should be between 5/8" and 3/4" with 11/16" being the nominal distance (article by Tom Endy). You can adjust this space to 11/16's by loosening or tightening the six finger adjustment nuts. VERY IMPORTANT to remember to re-stake the nuts after this adjustment. Reference the Mechanics Handbook page 1-66 to see any of this information. It was a great learning experience.
