The April board meeting will be on Tuesday, April 1st at 7PM at the Auto Driving Museum in El Segundo. All are welcome.





Technical Talk

DISTRIBUTOR 4 CYL.

Distributor Cams

The distributor cams used in the "A" and the improved 4-cylinder cars are shown in Fig. 48. Mechanics and stock men should familiarize themselves with these two cams so as to readily identify them. On the cam used in the "A" distributor the radius does not blend with the flats. On the new distributor cam the flats blend with one side of the radius.



The A-12210 distributor cam should never be used with the new distributor. Both A-12210 and B-12210 cams are available for service.

Ford Form 3027

NEW CAR DIRECTIONS

SPEED Avoid high speeds while the car is new. To obtain ER THAN 30 TO 35 MILES PER HOUR FOR THE FIRST 500 MILES.

OIL Keep the oil at "F" on the measuring rod, especially during the first few hundred miles. Never let it get below the mark "L." Remove measuring rod and wipe with a dry cloth before testing the level. OIL SHOULD BE CHANGED AFTER THE FIRST 500 MILES AND EVERY 500 MILES THEREAFTER.

BRAKES This car is equipped with 4-wheel mechanical brakes which are quick and positive in action. Keep the car under control at all times to avoid the necessity for sudden application of brakes which might result in discomfort to passengers or collision from rear.

FAN BELT Do not tighten fan belt. The V-type fan belt operation. Too tight an adjustment will result in excessive wear on fan belt and generator bearings, particularly at higher speeds.

TIRES For easy riding ualities, proper braking and long life keep the tires, both front and rear, inflated to

INSPECTION To insure best results have an Authorized FORD DEALER (preferably the Dealer from whom you purchased your car) inspect this car and make necessary minor adjustments after the first five hundred miles of running.

DRIVE SAFELY

Quick Tip by Dick Wyckoff

When you check the oil in your car, what do you do with the drop of oil on the dipstick?

A good place for the drop is on the water pump shaft by the front bearing or the rear seal. If you check the oil twice, put the drop in both places.

Detroit (NP) The Ford Motor Company, recognizing the runaway accelerators of various Toyota models, has swiftly reacted to a report of a Nebraska couple who reported that their Model A Ford suddenly experienced full-throttle, rocketing down the road at speeds up to 40 miles an hour. Although the cars are nearly a hundred years old, Ford quickly ordered a full recall of all 1928-1931 Fords to examine the accelerators.

Ford had spent nearly \$9 on the recall when it learned from the original owner of the first-reported runaway car that his wife, a blonde, had hung her purse on the gas lever.
