Technical Talk

A couple of clever ideas you could use

HOOD ANTI-CHIP PROTECTOR

A very simple solution to the problem of chipping the paint on your hood when latching the hood down with the hood handles is to cut four 1" to 2" lengths of fuel tubing, which are then cut length wise as shown.

Slide the tubing over the rolled lower edge of the hood and secure in place with a dab of silicone.



SAFE AND EASY WAY TO REMOVE A STUCK HEAD

If you are trying to remove your Model A head and it is stuck - simply remove all head nuts, if you haven't already. Take out all spark plugs and using your hand crank turn the engine over until pistons #2 and #3 are at top dead center. A flashlight will aid in looking in the #2 and #3 spark plug holes. Take two pieces of 3/8" nylon or cotton rope, several feet long and feed one end of each rope into the #1 and #4 cylinders through the spark plug holes. Then simply use the hand crank to com press the rope and with a little force on the crank, the head will lift right up. Try to use about the same length of rope in each cylinder so as to lift the head evenly.



A discussion on Fordbarn.com about 12 volts in the Model A.

The "wiring" is no different: Wiring designed to carry 6 V current will safely handle 12 V. However, you do have to change the coil or add a special resistor, all of the light bulbs, either change the horn or add a load resistor, and--depending whom you believe--change the field windings in the starter. ALSO, assuming that you are also switching from positive to negative ground, you will need to reverse the primary wires to the coil.

I'm assuming you're doing this by using a voltage regulated alternator.

Just to add to Steve's excellent info, If you replace the coil, you will want a 3.0 OHM for 12 volt. I use an epoxy <u>filled</u> coil. If you use an oil filled coil it will need to be mounted with the wire connections at the top. Original model A coils were tar filled . If an oil filled coil is used, oil can leak out and the coil will overheat and fail. If you want to run 12 volt positive ground with an original unmodified generator, NO wires will need to be changed or reversed. If an alternator is used with negative ground, the wires will need to be reversed at the ammeter and coil as Steve said above. I have run unmodified six volt starters on 12 volt since the sixties with no problem. I run a Fun Projects 12 volt can style voltage regulator in place of the cutout on the unmodified generator on my roadster.



With a couple local tours under our belts, it's time to think longer distance. Several club members have driven

or trailered their Model As to places like Laughlin or Paso Robles. Trailering is OK. Once you get to your destination, we end up putting another 100 to 200 miles on our cars. This is great fun espe-

cially sharing the adventure with 100 other of your closest Model A friends!

Coming up shortly (this weekend) we will be attending the Orange County Annual Pancake Breakfast in Orange CA. 300 - 350 other cars are there from all over So Cal. The Harbor Club will meet at the Harbor Freight (Hawthorne and Artesia) Sunday, April 27th at 6AM and leave at 6:15AM. We take the freeway to Orange County. We go 45 MPH and it take about 40 minutes. Because people leave at different times, we will





try to have a "buddy system" coming home so no one is driving alone.

We will be attending the Horseless Carriage Antique Car Tour to the Muckenthaler Museum in Fullerton again this year. The date is Sunday, May 18th.
