

Gary Guttormson's Model A needed a new head gasket. We installed one and tightened it down after he had driven it for a week. We also replaced and greased Gary's front wheel bearings ◆ Al Avoian's truck is now road worthy. It runs great and it now has been licensed and has all of the official paperwork completed. ◆ If anyone has a 29 speedometer Al Avoian is looking for one. ◆ This next Thursday July 31st will be the last Thursday that we gather at Al's Garage for our Technical Seminars. He shared a tip on how to create a tool/part that will save your starter if you are using a 12 volt battery on the Model A 6 volt system. This fix will help to stabilize the voltage between the 12 and 6 volt system. "Using a Bendix Spring, encapsulate the spring in a small piece of PVC leaving the ends sticking out for mounting, fill with silicone and install. The coil acts as an absorber to protect and lessen the pounding on the starter. The coil works to reduce the impact from 12 volt to around 7 volts when the voltage hits your starter. It is a cheap fix to preserve your starter."

Technical Talk

Recently at one of Al Avoian's garage meetings, there was a discussion about coils and the way they were mounted on the firewall. While visiting one of my favorite websites, **Fordbarn.com**, the discussion about coils appeared. Purdy Swoft is a regular, knowledgeable contributor and he posted his thoughts on the subject.

Re: Leaking coil

Original coils were tar filled. Oil filled coils that were used on later model cars were mounted with the tower and wire connections pointing upward. When oil filled coils are mounted with the wire connections pointed downward as the original model A coils were mounted, they will often leak oil out the tower, overheat and begin to fail. I've pointed out this fact here many, many times. The oil in the oil filled coils is for the purpose of cooling the inner windings. Most replacement coils are oil filled and are also weaker than the original model A coil. I don't mind saying as I have said many, many times before that I use the epoxy filled Pertronix flamethrower coil. This is a performance coil that scares hell out of many. It does however make a noticeable improvement in performance, instant starts and clean running spark plugs. Coils are rated in ohm. Six volt applications use a 1.5 ohm coil. Twelve volt applications use a 3.0 ohm version. Neither of these coils needs an external resister. It's the coil that fires the spark plugs. Weak replacement coils usually give weak performance and sooty spark plugs and most will tell you that you are running too rich. Weak ignition usually gets blamed on the carburetor. The original slant pole coils were around 20,000 volt. The Flame thrower coils are rated at 40,000 volts and make a difference that can be felt in the seat of the pants.

A few of us remember working on British cars. This will be a fun read for us who have experienced "Lucas Electrics"!

(Okay, this explanation of cause and effect is a little more scientific and dry than the usual humor - and very English.)

ELECTRICAL THEORY OF SMOKE by Joseph Lucas, "The Prince of Darkness," 1842-1903.

Positive ground depends on proper circuit functioning, which is the transmission of negative ions by retention of the visible spectral manifestation known as "smoke".

Smoke is the thing that makes electrical circuits work. We know this to be true because every time one lets the smoke out of an electrical circuit, it stops working. This can be verified repeatedly through empirical testing. For example, if one places a copper bar across the terminals of a battery, prodigious quantities of smoke are liberated and the battery shortly ceases to function. In addition, if one observes smoke escaping from an electrical component such as a Lucas voltage regulator, it will also be observed that the component no longer functions. The logic is elementary and inescapable!

The function of the wiring harness is to conduct the smoke from one device to another. When the wiring springs a leak and lets all the smoke out of the system, nothing works afterward.

Starter motors were considered unsuitable for British motorcycles for some time largely because they consumed large quantities of smoke, requiring very unsightly large wires.

It has been reported that Lucas electrical components are possibly more prone to electrical leakage than their Bosch, Japanese or American counterparts. Experts point out that this is because Lucas is British, and all things British leak. British engines leak oil, British shock absorbers, hydraulic forks and disk brake systems leak fluid, British tires leak air and British Intelligence leaks national defense secrets.

Therefore, it follows that British electrical systems must leak smoke. Once again, the logic is clear and inescapable.

In conclusion, the basic concept of transmission of electrical energy in the form of smoke provides a logical explanation of the mysteries of electrical components especially British units manufactured by Joseph Lucas, Ltd.
