Technical Talk

Gas Tank Shut-off Valve

If you're plagued with a leaking carburetor on your Model A, chances are that the gas tank shut-off valve isn't closing completely when turned to the off position. This trouble is usually the result of a loose fitting handle rather than a faulty valve core. Check the shut-off handle for lost motion. A loose handle means that there is not a full 90 degree turn of the valve between stops, consequently there is not a complete shut-off of gasoline.

Remove the handle and inspect both the squared shaft and the slot in the handle for wear. Using a machine hammer, peen the edges of the slot until there is a tight fit between the handle and the squared shaft. Next grind approximately 1/16" off the handle at the point that makes contact with the off position stop lug.

HOW TO START YOUR MODEL "A"

The first thing you do when you sit at the wheel, Put both feet on the pedals till you get the feel. The next thing to do if the car must go, Reach down for the petcock, to open the flow. While you're down there, give the choke a full turn, To increase combustion when the gas starts to burn. This also tends to make the mixture rich, Now we are ready to turn on the switch. Pull down on the throttle, and up with the spark. This is very important if you want her to start. Step on the starter as you pull out the choke, Till you hear the engine fire on her very first stroke. A little more choke if she's cold, will do. Let her idle gently, for a minute or two. If you'll pause a moment, before you put her in gear, You always avoid that unpleasant noise that we hear. Ever so gently you release the clutch, This you must practice, till you get the touch. If you always remember to press the clutch twice, You will shift gears gently, quiet, and nice. After you've driven at a moderate pace. Remember to screw the choke back to its place. With a tank full of gas and a smile on our faces, We've got the day off and we're off to the races.
