

Technical Talk

LED Tail Lights by Dick Wyckoff

Jan and I were at the MAFCA National Meet this last summer in Washington and I noticed that many of the touring cars had very bright, visible tail lights / running lights. This was very obvious when we were stretched out along the highway and the bright lights really stood out. I finally talked to one of the drivers of the cars and he told me that the bright lights were LED tail lights. I was aware of LED lights but didn't associate them with Model As until then. When asked where he got them, he replied most of the parts vendors sell them.

This last month I checked the catalogs and found them listed along with the standard bulb-type tail light. I called Bratton's and told Walt what I had and he guided me to the parts I needed. They were here in a couple days and I installed them. What a difference!

The lights come in different configurations. You have 6V or 12V, left / right, all red lens or red and amber, complete assembly or LED inserts. Some additional resistance in the circuit to make them work properly may be needed. Instructions come with the assemblies.

I have turn indicators in my cowl lights and turn indicators in the tail lights, too. Just for the record, I purchased Bratton's part numbers 18982 and 18992 complete assemblies. I took the old original assemblies off and replaced them with the new ones. No fancy wiring, Nothing. Bolt on. They are working just fine. Turn indicators work, hazard warning lights work, stop lights work. All is well.

I took a couple pictures of the before and after results. I think you will agree that they do make a big difference.




Original Bulb-type Tail Light Before replacement

Restored or Over-Restored?

While at the MAFCA meet in Washington, I did a little study on landau irons on Cabriolets. I chose Cabriolets because I have one and spent 6 years gathering parts and information. My car is far from perfect, but I left parts unrestored to preserve their character and detail. Landau irons specifically.

One item of interest to me is the landau irons on a Cabriolet. Unrestored has a lot of detail that can easily be removed by the plating and buffing processes. I took some pictures to illustrate my point.

Check the detail around the point of the design. Originally, it was very sharp. When not properly handled in the plating /polishing process, the beautiful detail is destroyed or almost completely removed. See for yourself.

It all started with Jan saying "What do you want to do today?" on our 33rd wedding anniversary. As it turns out, the Experimental Aircraft Association was displaying their 1929 Ford Tri-Motor airplane at the Long Beach CA Airport that day. Having never seen the plane up close, I decided we should drive our 1930 Ford Cabriolet to Long Beach to see it. It was a kind-of a double celebration because we drove the car for the first time after it's restoration on our 25th anniversary in 2007

Anyway, we went from El Segundo to Long Beach and met with the EAA folks and, with some help from Tom Sutfin, we got permission to do a photo op with the plane. The folks in charge were very friendly and enjoyed

the moment as much as we did. We probably stayed with the plane for a half

hour and many folks used the opportunity for their photos, too.

A little history of the aircraft: Henry Ford brought mobility to millions of Americans and created a new market with his Model T'Tin Lizzie' automobile from 1909 to 1927. After WWI, he recognized the growing potential for mass air transportation. Ford's Tri-Motor aircraft, nicknamed 'Tin Goose', was designed to build another new market, airline travel. To overcome concerns of engine reliability, Ford specified three engines and added features for passenger comfort, such as an enclosed cabin.

Ford Motor Company built 199 tri-motors from 1926 through 1933. EAA's model 4-AT-E was number 146 off Ford's innovative assembly line and

first flew on August 21, 1929.

The plane was sold to Pitcairn Aviation's passenger division, Eastern Air Transport, whose paint scheme is replicates on EAA's Tri-Motor. This is why the Ford resides in the Pitcairn Hanger at Pioneer Airport. Eastern Air Transport later became Eastern Airlines.

The plane was used in several ways, such as barnstorming in 1949. At that time it was refitted with two 450 HP engines and one 550 HP engine and used as a crop duster. Further modifications in 1958 for use by smoke jumpers.

After several years of various roles including movies, it was at a fly -in in Wisconsin when a severe wind storm ripped the plane from it's tie-downs, lifted it 50 feet in the air and smashed it to the ground on its back. EAA subsequently purchased the wreckage for its Aviation Foundation.

After a 12 year restoration by EAA staff and volunteers, the plane took to the air again in its official debut at the 1985 EAA convention in

Oshkosh. It was displayed until 1991 when it returned to its former role of delighting passengers on tour.






