

"A" View from the Slow Lane

It was about six years ago that Pat and I attended our first CCRG in Bakersfield CA. We met many new people, went to some informational seminars, found out that some Model As had Ford Pinto engines and air conditioning as well as being introduced to Hubley model car races.

A little Hubley background: The Hubley Company was founded by John Hubley in 1894 in Lancaster PA for the purpose of manufacturing toys. In 1960 the company began producing 1/25 scale model, die-cast metal kits. Among the kits were seven Model A body styles: sedan, station wagon, roadster, roadster pickup, coupe, Victoria, and phaeton. Sometime later the company was sold and the manufacture of Hubley kits ceased. Today kits are somewhat of a collector's item, with the Model A kits being sought by many in the Model A hobby.

Last year we had our second Harbor Model A Club picnic at Torrance Park and Bobby DeCrescenzo brought the club's Hubley track. (Bobby built the track several years ago and we always enjoy racing

on it.) At the picnic, many club members competed in both the men's and women's divisions. Since last year there has been much more interest in the racing sport. We had two Saturdays at Al's Garage set aside for Hubley workshops. Daffy W., Gloria Y., Pat H., Dr. Steve, and Jim S., all took advantage of the help of Hubley experts. Greg Earhart conducted a seminar of the 'official rules' (yes, there are rules) of Hubley competition. Bobby D, Jack G, and Steve N, all added their knowledge to the discussion and workshop. A big thanks goes out to the team of experts from both the Club and the members who took advantage of their help. 

Technical Talk

MOTOMETER MISBEHAVIN'? ~ AN EXERCISE IN FUTILITY-MAYBE!



Heat to a medium boil and wait for both thermometers to reach their highest point. Turn off the heat and calibrate your MotoMeter in relation to the known thermometer <u>as they slowly cool</u>. You cannot easily calibrate the MotoMeter to the thermometer during the temperature rise when heating the water because the mass and thermal transfer rate differences will cause a lag in the MotoMeter response. Does your MotoMeter only work part-time? Sad thing about MotoMeters. For many Model A's once the radiator "burps" and finds its own running water level the meter either reads nothing or inaccurately low because the water is below the sensor. Then when the water gets to a boil while you are going one mph in a parade, the water level rises in the radiator and the red line shoots sky high! Oops! Too late. Oh, well. It looks nice when parked.


The Fix. Original radiators will usually run with the water level high enough to constantly operate the MotoMeter, but most replacements will not. A durable 2" long wick made by tightly wrapping three or four layers of canvas or heavy fabric and brass screen around the threaded base, secured to the base threads with a small ¼ wide stainless steel hose clamp may help make your MotoMeter work. You must include the brass screen in and around the wick wrappings to keep the fabric from slowly disintegrating into your radiator! Wrap a spiral of brass or S.S. wire like a spring around the length of the wick to keep it together. You will probably also need to extend the internal radiator overflow tube upwards, to a point about 1/4" from the top of the neck. A piece of tight fitting rubber fuel hose pushed down onto the existing overflow tube should work. The extension hose must be a snug press onto the tube or the overflow will constantly drip. If you have a twist and flip cap it will all be a tight fit! Check your cap gasket, too.

Once you get that MotoMeter behaving, it may be nice to know what the temperature actually is. Make a drawing of the face of your MotoMeter and pick some easy reference points like I did in the illustration. Then calibrate it. If yours needs a wick to work, calibrate it with the wick attached, adjusting the water level in your setup to approximate the water level in your radiator. Without a wick the sensor should be at least 1/8" in the water. *Mike Keating*


