

### Technical Talk

### TECHNICAL REPORT: Ron Peterson

### When Was the Last Time You?

- Greased your throw-out bearing. To do this job remove floor mats and floorboards and clutch inspection plate. Grease bearing through fitting on throw-out collar. Do not
- 2. Packed your wheel bearings. Remove wheels and drums; wash the bearings and races thoroughly. Packing beating with wheel bearing grease and reassemble. Do not forget the cotter pin.

  3. Flushed your crankcase. Drain oil – refill with kerosene, or diesel oil or special flushing oil. Run engine twenty
- minutes or so, then drain and refill with clean fresh oil. Make sure drain plug is in tight.
- 4. Greased your light switch shaft. Remove light switch on bottom of steering column, remove fork and spring that operate light switch, pull shaft out or up as far as possible and clean grease off. Use light cup grease after you wiped shaft off. Reassemble unit.
- 5. Greased your speedometer cable. Remove dash panel and disconnect speedometer cable. Pull out the small inside cable and wash thoroughly. Pack with light cup grease and reinstall in the cawing. Wipe off excess grease and replace
- 6. Oiled your gas pedal linkage. There are three places to oil. Behind the engine on the shafts supports there are holes drilled for oiling. Also where the rod connects from the carburetor.
  7. Tighten your lug nuts. Use firm even pressure on all lug nuts. Be sure to see whether nuts are pressing the wheel
- to the drum or just bottoming on the studs. A wheel that is not properly bolted to the drum can be ruined in very short
- Checked the oil in the transmission and rear end. Keep level up to the filler plug, use 600W (SAE160) in both.
- This oil can be obtained at Sears Roebuck or any big truck stop. Be sure it is non-foam.

  9. Cleaned and flushed the cooling system. The cheapest and best products for this is Arm & Hammer washing soda into radiator and f8ill with water, run hot for a half hour and then drain. Flush system out several times with clean wa-
- Tightened the fan belt. Loosen generator mounting bolt, move generator away from block until most of the slack is taken up in the belt. Tighten belt. Then check belt to see if adjustment has changed.
   Rotated your tires. Spare to right front, right front to left rear, left rear to right rear, right rear to left front, left
- front to spare. Follow some pattern in each rotation.
- 12. Checked your radiator hoses and clamps. Feel hose, if soft and gummy, replace them. Same with split or rotten ones. Check for tightness and watch for broken ones.
- 13. Had your front wheel aligned. Should be done on special equipment. (See A cheap and cheerful approach in Echo April 1993 page 8)...
- 14. Oiled your generator. There should be two oil holes on the generator. The rear one is easy, the front one is protected by an "L" shaped clip that has to be removed to one side.
- Spent an hour tightening nuts and boits all over the car. Self-explanatory.
   Adjusted your point gap in the distributor. Ford recommends a gap of .018, .022 check the gap at least every 500 miles
- 17. Check the air in the spare tire. Self- explanatory.
- 18. Checked out your emergency tool kit. Including a jack. To each his own, should include points, condenser,
- plugs, wire, tools and a fire extinguisher.

  19. Adjusted your emergency brake. Take up the slack with the clevises on the forward end of the emergency brake When there is no more adjustment left reline the bands.
- 20. Filled your shock absorbers. On all original shocks, there is a filler plug located near the top of the unit. It has a 3/8 square nut on it, use only Houdaille, Ford or Delco shock absorber fluid or use glycerin.
- 21. Cleaned and tightened your battery connections. Most corrosion and sulfate deposits can be washed off in a solution of baking soda and then flushed with warm water. Pull cables off the terminals and clean the contact surfaces with rough sandpaper or file. Flush with warm water and reattach them. The use of Vaseline or light cup grease after assembly is recommended
- 22. Polished headlight reflectors. Use very soft cloth or cotton with silver polish, not chrome polish as it will scratch and dull the reflection. When polished, use new gaskets.
- 23. Check out all your light bulbs. Self-explanatory.

## A Little South Bay History By Pat Tucker

Hope you can use this picture. It is of my father and brother sawing lumber for our home that he was building for us. They were using our 1929 Model A Tudor sedan on blocks with a large belt attached to a rear wheel to run the saw blade. Our whole house was built from lumber that my father cut from, what they then called dunnage from the docks. He would haul it home on brackets that he made to fit over the fenders on one side of the car. He stockpiled it until they decided to build.

The house that he built was located where Carson High School is now located. The picture was taken around 1944-45. At that time the Model A was our family car and work horse all in one.



### Give your "Model A" a Check Up !!

My Model A had just reached 16,000 miles -- so it was time to do the preventive maintenance check. I follow the procedure from the Les Andrews Mechanics Handbook. There is a check to do monthly, at 500 miles, at 1,000 miles, at 2,000 miles, at 5,000 miles, and at 10,000 miles. Each subsequent check adds more things on, to be looked at. So , as I was doing my check on the ignition -- I found that the points would adjust but not lock down. Upon further inspection, I found the point block lock screw that helps to keep the points set had stripped out and would not tighten down. This will cause a problem, in that the points will have a tendency to close their gap causing the engine to run rough and eventually, not at all. I was able to change the point block assembly on the distributor top plate without removing the distributor. I was happy to find this the day before we went on the fireboat tour or there might have been a problem for me! I had a spare point block to use and have now ordered another one from Snyders Antique auto parts.

I would highly recommend that you do your service checks when your car is due. It just might save you from a "roadside seminar"!
