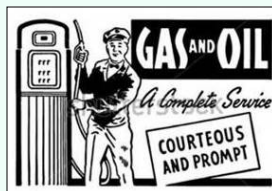

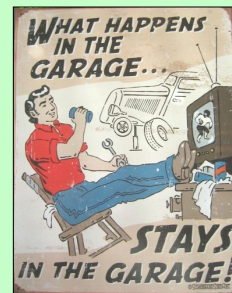
Tours

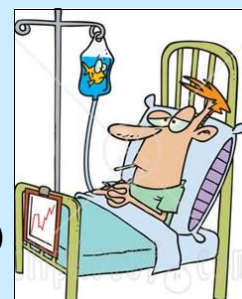

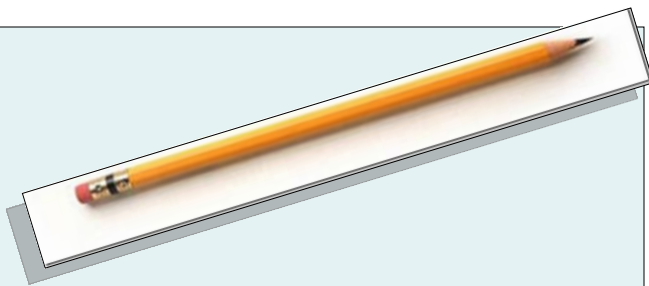

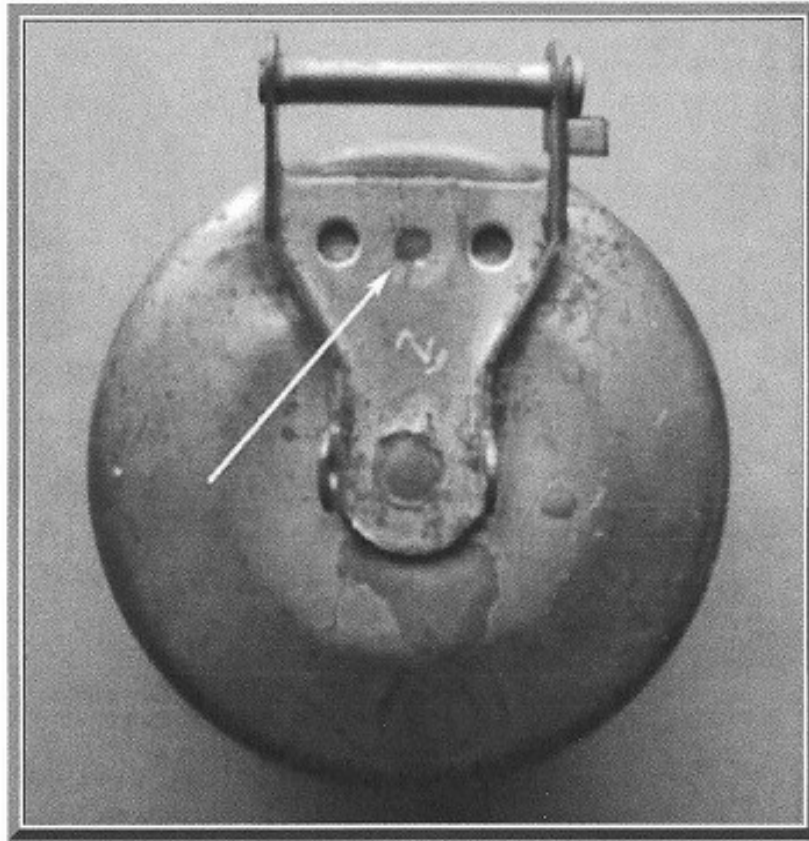

Technical Talk

Technical Tip - Carburetor Float Wear

Carburetor Float Wear

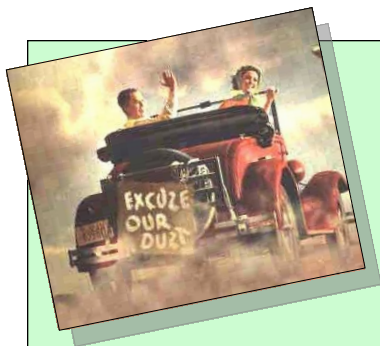
Most Model A carburetors encountered today have been subjected to considerable use. The most frequently overlooked side effect of that use is a small dimple worn into top of the float from the valve needle. The effect of this dimple is a lateral bind on the valve needle that prevents it from closing completely and sealing.

The brass float material is fairly soft and easy to blend out the ridges of the dimple by sanding from front to back by hand, then buffing. There are many alternatives, but choose your best method to carefully taper and blend the surface and the valve will operate smoothly and reliably.

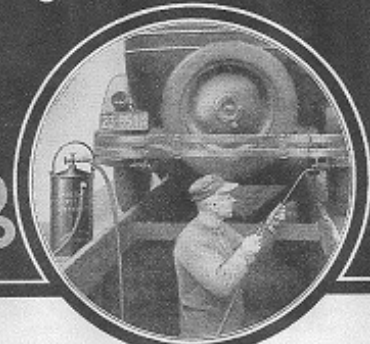

Traffic Signal Finders

These handy little gadgets were quite popular in the early days of automobiles. For the Model A, the design with the visor sticking out over the windshield made seeing the overhead traffic signals difficult to see without scrunching down and twisting your neck. These little reflectors worked similar to our modern side mirrors that say "objects in mirror are closer than they seem". The concave shape makes objects look smaller and closer. It also shows a wider angle view, like a fish eye lens. All in all, they seemed to work quite well as they remained popular throughout the 50's.

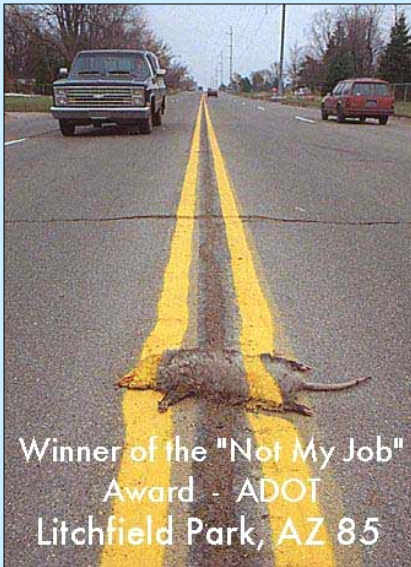


MAFCA 2017 Membership Renewals
