We have been busy at Al's Garage getting Jim's 'Minnie Mouse House' going. A fun project with a few laughs thrown in.


Also, Steve got his Phaeton engine back from Vallios. We are preparing the car as we speak.




TINY TIPS



SECURING RADIATOR ORNAMENTS

If a quail or other permanent base, flip-top radiator ornament fits loosely or is chipped, it may come off too easily. This procedure will remedy the situation and make the ornament solid - removable only with an Allen wrench. My quail used to fit so loosely that I removed it whenever I left the Ford unattended. Remove the brass lugs on the bottom of your cap. These are usually held on with Allen head screws. See figure A. Cut a piece of metal bar with the same width as the removed lugs. The bar should be about the same thickness as the lugs. The length of the bar should be as long as possible within the diameter of the radiator neck under the flange. Test the cut bar for fit. It should have about 3/16" play on the ends. Drill and tap the bar to accommodate the Allen head screws. See Figure B. Some of the material may have to be removed from the area of the lugs on the cap base. If so, file very carefully and remove only the necessary material for the bar to fit snugly. Notch the radiator neck flange with a small file (or a broken round file chucked in an electric drill) where the new bar will be when the cap is in place. File and fit until this notch is as deep as practical for your cap. See Figure C.

Allen head screws. As the screws are tightened, the bar will be pulled up into the notches, holding the base firmly. The bar does cover part of the radiator opening, but it doesn't keep you from checking the coolant level nor does it interfere with the overflow tube.



Jim's technical tip for May

"Most carburetor problems are electrical." In other words, when your Model A starts running poorly and you think you have a carburetor problem, first look at the ignition system. How old is your condenser, how good are your points, is the point gap correct? Are all of the connections between the coil, ignition switch and distributor clean and tight? If you have a wire inside your distributor between the lower plate and the upper plate, what con-dition is it in? Is the ignition switch making a good connection inside? These things are as common as carburetor problems, if not more so, to cause your engine to run poorly.

A Fun Morning at Al's Garage

Below is an Email from Dennis Simpson when I asked him about starting Jim Huizdos' engine. . . .

Hey Dick. Sorry so late getting back to you.

Monty, Jack, Jim, Tim and I met at Al's Garage at ~9am Tuesday morning.

Yes, Monty and Jim installed the radiator and hoses. But no coolant in it yet. Plan was to just fire it off and not stay too long. Monty and Jack had wifely duties and Tim had asked me to help him with his radiator for the Woody.

On Saturday we couldn't get any spark. Cliff changed out the points and condenser but still no spark. We pulled the distributor back out because we were not getting power to the points but had power to the lead from the switch to the distributor. We found we couldn't screw the wire into the distributor body far enough to make contact with the lower plate. Jack took the distributor home and re-tapped the threads so we could screw the wire in all the way. Once all of us were satisfied we had power to the points, as reinforced by the big, fat, blue spark that came out of the coil when the distributor was "accidentally grounded". After Jack reinstalled the distributor I retimed it. We then fired it off with starter fluid. It started right up. A bunch of berries or nuts flew out of the tail pipe...

Next we decided to add gas to the tank to allow it to run a little longer. The tank looks really clean inside. But it had no flow out of the tank. We pulled the fuel line to the carburetor which was plugged and cleaned it out. Still no flow. Pulled the shut off valve and cleaned it out. Tried to start the engine but now no fuel flow to the carb again. I pulled the plug on the bottom of the carb. Dry as a bone. I thought the float was stuck so I pulled the carb, pulled the float bowl off and blew thru the needle valve. Reinstalled the carb. Still no flow!!

Jim then pulled the fuel filter apart and we found that the paper filter element was incorrect and was blocking the outlet. Reassemble the glass bowl without the filter and all was good.

Jim hit the starter and she fired right up! Lots of smoke!! I don't know if you can see it in the video. There were smiles all around.

The engine sounds really good and has no unusual noises. We shut it down as it was starting to warm up (and Monty reminding me there was no coolant in the radiator). It was now early afternoon (and I think we were gassing Al out!) so we called it a day.


Besides we wanted to save some fun for another day at Al's Garage.


Then we were off to help Tim lift in his radiator. Hope this cures his overheating. The Radiator shop said the radiator was 30% plugged.
