TINY TIPS

IDLING

If you just can't seem to make your Model A idle properly (ta-puck-a-ta, puck-a-ta, puck-a ta) like they are famous for, check the following:

- Are your valves in good condition?
 No burned exhausts valves
 Compression good?
- 2. Is the carburetor okay? Has it been checked out?
- Is the distributor okay? New condenser, etc.?
- 4. No excess play in the distributor linkage?
- Do you have Champion 3X spark plugs? Are they fairly new plugs?
- 6. Is the spark plug gap 0.035" to 0.040"?
- Look for possible leaks in the intake system like manifold gaskets, cracked intake manifold, faulty windshield wiper hose or fittings.
- 8. Check for manifold leaks by spraying a very light liquid like WD-40 along the manifold to block gasket while the engine is idling. Does it slow down? If it does your manifold gaskets might be leaking. The gaskets could be improperly installed or the manifold surfaces could be warped.




