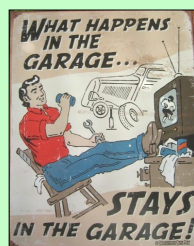

The banquet is our special and fun way of wrapping up the old year and bringing in the new. We hope all of you will join in the festivities.

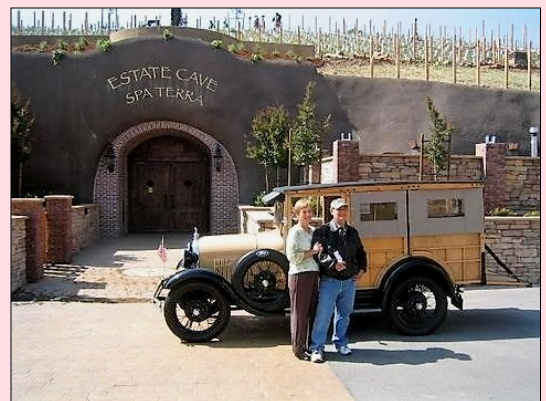

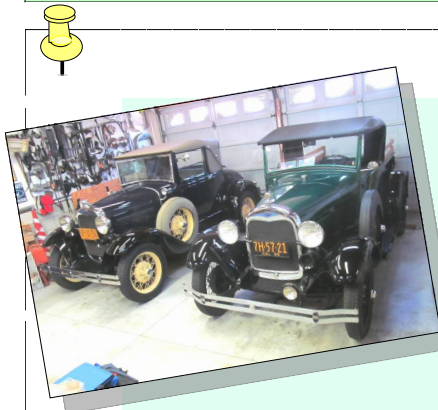

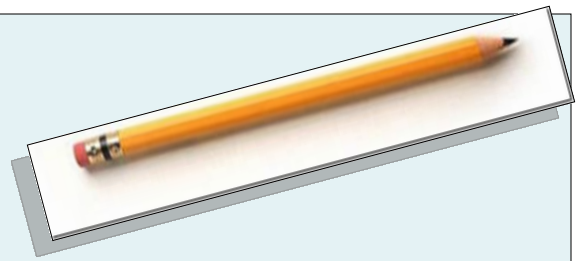

California DMV

There is an obscure California vehicle code that exempts Model A pick up trucks from having to be weighed and issued commercial license plates. In fact any pre-1937 commercial vehicle is exempt under the law. The problem is that most DMV clerks are not aware of the vehicle code and will insist that a Model A pick up (delivery van or AA truck) must be weighed and issued commercial plates, which is a higher fee. It then becomes necessary to bring the clerk's attention to the vehicle code.

Below is a copy of California vehicle code 9401. Note that the double talk in part (b) is saying that if the owner of a pre-1937 truck wants commercial license plates, for whatever reason, the DMV will oblige them.

It is also a good idea to clip a copy of this vehicle code to the registration slip of any Model A pick up, delivery van, or AA truck registered with passenger vehicle license plates. In the event that you are ever stopped by law enforcement you will be able to show that the vehicle is exempt from being required to have commercial plates.

Div. 3 —275— §9406.1

privilege of using its streets or highways, other than a permit fee for extra legal loads, after December 31, 1990, unless the local agency had imposed the fee prior to June 1, 1989.

Added Ch. 1337, Stats. 1989, Effective January 1, 1990.

Weight Fee for Pre-1937 Year Model Vehicles

9401. (a) Motor vehicles manufactured in or prior to 1936, are exempted from the payment of the weight fees provided for in Section 9400.

(b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), any person who owns and operates a commercial vehicle manufactured in or prior to 1936 which is registered to such person, may pay the appropriate weight fees, and the department shall issue license plates of the same type as are issued to vehicles which are required to pay weight fees for such vehicles.

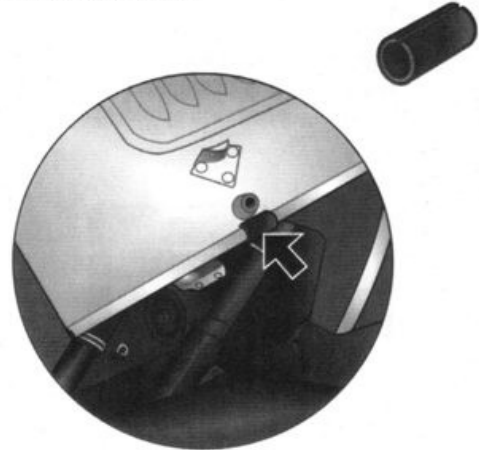

Some Interesting Information

HOOD ANTI-CHIP PROTECTOR

A very simple solution to the problem of chipping the paint on your hood when latching the hood down with the hood handles is to cut four 1" to 2" lengths of fuel tubing, which are then cut length wise as shown.

Slide the tubing over the rolled lower edge of the hood and secure in place with a dab of silicone.



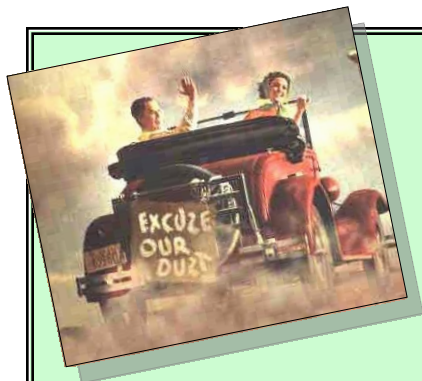

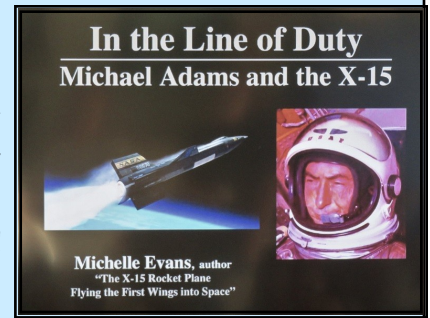
Western Museum of Flight tour

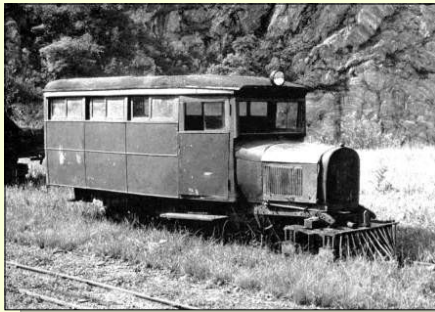
