

Many of us are driving our cars more due to the great weather we have been having. I dusted off






Looking forward to some swap meets coming up soon. You never know what you need until you see it!

Technical Talk

Service Information

PLATE LEVER NOTCH IN DIS-TRIBUTOR BODY MUST NOT BE ALTERED



Several instances have been reported of dealers increasing the width of the plate lever notch in the distributor body in endeavoring to increase the travel of the plate lever.

This is exceedingly poor practice and must be discontinued at once.

The plate lever notch in the distributor body is accurately machined to permit the lever to travel 20° from the fully retarded to the fully advanced spark lever position. See Fig. 950. When the width of the notch is increased it permits the lever to travel beyond the recommended 20° range and this of course affects the timing.

Before timing an engine always check the travel of the plate lever. This can be easily done by fully retarding the spark lever on the steering gear quadrant then noting whether the plate lever is touching against the side of the notch. Next pull the spark lever all the way down on the quadrant to the fully advanced position and see if the plate lever is touching the opposite side of the notch. If the plate lever does not make the full 20° travel disconnect the spark control rod (see Fig. 951) and slightly bend the control rod lever (see Fig. 952) until the plate lever



touches one side of notch in distributor body when spark lever is fully advanced and touches opposite side when lever is fully retarded. Do not under any circumstances attempt to correct this condition by increasing the width of notch in distributor body.

After checking travel of plate lever proceed with timing operation in usual way. When the timing operation is completed the travel of the lever should again be checked. When timing ignition do not remove distributor body.

Inasmuch as there has been some misunderstanding on the part of mechanics please make correct travel of plate lever a part of your regular inspection.





Coffield Collection of Model "A" Advertisements

Al Coffield was an active member of the Model A Ford community in the Phoenix area. In addition to enjoying Model A cars, Al collected Model A era ads. He passed away in 1993 and in 1995 his estate donated a large collection of Model A era ads to MAFFI.

Most of the activity in the past years involving the Coffield Ad collection is connected with the use of the presentation seminar prepared by MAFFI and now being used by various clubs.

The program provides insight into the techniques used to promote sales of the Model A

during its years of manufacture. MAFFI solicits additions to both the ad collection and the photograph collection from anyone who has examples that should be preserved and shared with other members of the hobby, present and future.

The collection contains over 600 magazine and newspaper ads, including many foreign ads. The typical ad in the collection shows the methods and techniques of Ford advertising and revealing those things which Ford considered to be important to car and truck buyers of that era.

Member clubs have the opportunity to see a selection of these ads in color. MAFFI will provide a set of transparencies and a script. Your club need only provide an overhead projector and a screen. This program is also available on a DVD.

ASSIGNMENT OF MODEL A PART NUMBERS BY FORD

Assignment of part numbers at Ford was not random but instead was approached in a logical manner. Groups of numbers were assigned according to the parts function. An example of this is that the engine components were assigned numbers from 6000 through 6999 (a complete list of these groups of numbers is contained in the table). Continuing the example within the block of numbers, "6050" was assigned to the cylinder head. This number would continue to define the cylinder head as future parts were identified by new prefixes and suffixes. When later V8's required a different cylinder head for each side of the engine the left head continued to be numbered "6050" while the right head was designated "6049".

The prefix to the number represented the application for which the part was first used. All Model A (1928-1931) part numbers began with "A" for passenger vehicles and "AA" for heavy trucks. When the 1932 vehicles were introduced the part numbers began with "B" for the 4 cylinder and parts common with the V8, with "18" for the parts unique to the V8 and with "BB" for the large trucks. Any Model A parts that were used in the 1932 vehicles were renumbered. An example of this is the valve spring retainer. Part number A-6514 was renumbered to B-6514 and shown in the later Ford part books as being used 1928 through 1934. This part (as well as other renumbered parts) was a functional replacement that may or may not be identical to the original part used in the Model A.

Ford was interested in building "drivers" not "show cars". Current catalogs from Model A parts suppliers may show either part number (or their own number). Any part that was unique to the Model A retained the "A" prefix. This concept is important to the Model A owner because it explains why some Model A parts in the suppliers catalogs carry a "B" prefix while others have an "A" prefix.

The model year 1932 was the last time that Ford would completely renumber all of the parts. In 1933 the prefix was "40" for the passenger car, "46" for the commercial and "BB" for the large trucks. Parts that remained the same from 1932 were not renumbered.

If after the original release of the part a change was made such that the part was not functionally interchangeable, a suffix was added to the part number beginning with "A" and extending through the alphabet. If more than one configuration was required within a given prefix and basic part number it would also receive a different suffix.





