



Technical Talk

Model A Ads

Have you ever looked at the Model A ads from when they were new? Each ad has a Model A going about daily life while telling us how safe or practical or sporty they are. But there are more to these ads than just the cars.


Even back then, Advertisers knew how to throw in subliminal messages. These are messages that are not so obvious when you look at the ads, yet still send a deliberate message that they want you to catch. It's like when Coke or Pepsi pays someone in a movie to be shown drinking their soda. They hope we get the message that the hero or star is knowledgeable about what tastes best so we'll want to buy it also! Well, Henry Ford did that with his advertisements too.

Here are some examples of what I'm talking about. The first thing we see of course is the Model A in each picture. But now look at the background. Can you see it? In each of these below pictures, Ford included another powerful form of transportation. #1 has an electric street car in the right corner. Not too obvious, but it's there. #2 has a large yacht while #3 has a huge ocean liner, both filling up the backgrounds. #4 & #5 both make use of a train, one very obvious, and the other more subtle. #6 shows a sea plane just behind our speedy little car.

Also, look at how many of these also have some type of workers in them, although never the Model A drivers! #1 has a servant holding packages. #2 has a captain and a chef ready to serve. #3 has crew members helping with the luggage, and #6 has the pilot ready to take off. There are other subtle messages in there too! Look at #4 and see how the smoke of the engine has the same angle and density as the dust along the wheels of the Model A. And in almost all of them, at least one of the bystanders is looking and admiring the Model A.



Harbor Area Model A Member Places in Fine Point Judging

Michael and his 1931 Deluxe Roadster, model 40B took to the road this August to the MARC National meet in Dearborn, Michigan.

I am fairly new to the hobby, having met neighbor Joe Brun in 2015 and joining MARC and MAFCA that year. By July, 2016 I found the 31 Roadster, advertised in Hemmings Motor News and it arrived from Illinois a few weeks later. Joe helped me get the car sorted out and I drove it to many local events including the Orange County pancake breakfasts and picnics in El Segundo and Downey.

The 2019 MARC national in Dearborn was a major attraction for me. I have been making Detroit a destination for car events since 2000 and taking my Model A to this event was a must on my bucket list. Mark Maron, event chair communicated with me to explain judging and what the difference was between touring and fine point. Pictures were exchanged and he convinced me to move my car up from Touring Class, which the previous owner had won awards since 2003. Now this was an essentially stock/non modified Model A with 1400 miles and though still very nice, would need a great deal of work to be judged in fine point class.

Well, I took the challenge. Joe and another Model A'er, Mark Gaulin, lent a hand and commentary as I worked furiously to get the car ready per the judging manual. The LeBaron-

Bonney company shutdown left me topless for a while and that was no easy obstacle to overcome. Had it not been for that, I may have had a better faring with points but I did manage 385 points out of 500, enough for a First Place level award (note that Mark of Excellence is 425 points and The Henry Award is 480 points or more).

I was elated to place and learned a great deal of how the Model A was assembled and what parts are factory correct in appearance. My 31 looks better and runs better for this effort. I look forward to sharing my experience with photos of the 2019 Nationals with the Harbor Area club in the near future.
