A View From the Slow Lane

Who Was Henry Ford?

Henry Ford (1863 - 1947) was an American industrialist who is most renowned for his path-breaking contributions to the automobile industry. After building an early horseless carriage, he ventured into the automobile business by founding the Ford Motor Company.

Here are his 10 major accomplishments:

In 1896, at the age of 32, Henry Ford completed his first experimental self-propelled vehicle or automobile. He called it the Quadricycle as it ran on four bicycle tires. It was powered by a two-cylinder, four-horsepower gasoline engine.

Henry Ford founded the Ford Motor Company, which was incorporated on June 16, 1903. The company was launched with a capital of \$28,000, which came from twelve investors owning a total of 1000 shares. Henry Ford and Alexander Y. Malcomson held the maximum number of shares with 255.

In October 1908, the Model T of Ford made its debut. It was priced at \$850 and, through assembly line production, its cost continued to reduce till it was less than \$300 in 1925.

The moving assembly line was developed by Ford and it began operation on October 7, 1913, at the Highland Park Ford Plant. The process to build a Model T was divided into 45 steps. Using conveyor belts, the moving assembly line reduced the time it took to build a car from more than 12 hours to around 2 hours and 30 minutes.

On January 5, 1914, Henry Ford introduced the \$5 day wage to his employees, doubling their pay. This resulted in an immediate increase in productivity since the best mechanics in Detroit started to join Ford Motors. This in turn led to a stabilized workforce, accumulation of skilled human resources and lowering of training costs

On May 1, 1926, Ford made another revolutionary change by reducing shifts from nine hours to an eight-hour a day for a 5-day work week. This decision was made as Ford believed that workers would put in more effort into their works in exchange for increased leisure time.

During World War I, Henry Ford entered the aviation business building mass produced Liberty aircraft engines. In 1925, the Ford Motor Company bought out the Stout Aircraft Company and began construction of the all-metal Ford Trimotor. The Ford Trimotor became the first successful American airliner and it made passenger service potentially profitable

On January 15, 1936, Henry Ford, along with his son Edsel Ford, established the Ford Foundation. The aim of the foundation was to pave the way for research, education and development by providing ongoing grants. It had a global reach and, among other things, its interest included economic empowerment, education, human rights, democracy, the creative arts and development of third world countries.

Henry Ford is credited with the development of Fordism, a concept in manufacturing that standardized mass production and consumption. It has been used by numerous writers on economics and society. The three major principles that constitute Fordism are: standardization of the product; usage of highly efficient assembly lines; and higher wages for the workers.

Henry Ford is regarded as one of the most influential people of the 20th century. In 1928, Henry Ford was awarded the Elliott Cresson medal by Franklin Institute in Philadelphia. In 1946, Ford was admitted into the Automotive Hall of Fame, an American museum. In 1975, 38 years after his death, he was inducted into the Junior Achievement's U.S. Business Hall of Fame. In December 1999, Henry Ford was among 18 people included in the Gallup's List of Widely Admired People of the 20th Century. Moreover, in 1999, the TIME magazine included Henry Ford in its list of the 100 most influential people of the 20th century.

Re-engineering the Model A Engine

Long-time MAFCA member Terry Burtz of Campbell, California has long been working on a project to have a new Model A engine block, crankshaft and connecting rods manufactured. The engine will be identical to the original Model A engine on the outside but will have 5 main bearings, a balanced crankshaft, and full pressurized oil system.



He began this project in 2007 and has

worked with California foundries for several years trying to get an end product that would cost about the same as rebuilding an original Model A engine. The



project stalled in 2015, and for the last 4 years there has been no news.

However, this year Terry got in touch with a man with businesses in China and USA that manufactures engines. They have met and discussed Terry's project and it looks like the project is back on track.

The team is hopeful that they

will have the first machines samples available by late fall 2019 and will send updates including pictures as the project matures.



Friend, Rob Hernandez, said "No Problem". Well it turned out to be somewhat of a problem. Bad tires, stuck engine, bad radiator, dirty oil. . . You know the drill. Anyway, Janet invited the 'Al's Garage' gang to her home to see what we could do. She said she would buy the coffee, donuts and hot dogs if we could get it going. (We couldn't turn down that offer!)

With an offer like that, 10 guys and several wives took her up on the offer. The gals gossiped (or whatever they do) and went to a local church sale and shopped. The guys got busy. It wasn't long before the pan was off, the carb was off, the plugs were out, fuel lines/filters cleaned/replaced, and the engine was freed up. With everything cleaned up inside, it was reassembled and the fun began. The distributor was removed, checked out and reinstalled.
